STONEWALL : Not Just History

According to our National Survey on LGBTQ Youth Mental Health:

- 76% of LGBTQ youth felt that the recent political climate impacted their mental health or sense of self
- 71% of LGBTQ youth in our study reported discrimination due to either their sexual orientation or gender identity





One supportive person can decrease an LGBTQ youth's risk of suicide by 40%. The Trevor Project works to be that person. (And you can too...)

90% of youth we serve report significant reduction in suicidal ideation after using our services.

TrevorAdvocacy

Our advocacy work at the federal, state, and local levels includes publicly advocating for/against particular bills and filing/joining amicus briefs in major cases to protect LGBTQ rights.

What is Conversion Therapy?

- From the past to the present, it is always harmful.
- Every major medical organization has declared that conversion therapy is discredited and dangerous.
- The Trevor Project witnesses its harm to LGBTQ youth every week, and has documented it in research







The Numbers

- There are nearly 700,000 survivors of conversion therapy;
 20,000 LGBTQ youth are at risk of receiving conversion
 therapy from a licensed mental health professional in the next
 few years.
- 5% of youth ages 13-25 responding to the Trevor Project
 National Survey on LGBTQ Youth Mental Health said they had
 been subjected to conversion or reparative therapy.





The Heartbreaking Numbers

42% of LGBTQ youth who have experienced conversion therapy said they had a suicide attempt in the last 12 months.

When we asked just trans and non-binary youth, the number rises to 57%.



The State(s) of Play

- 20 states
 protected
- 19 more bills introduced
- Dozens of city and municipal ordinances
- Resolutions, executive orders, regulations...







Where You Fit In



- Why NAMI is important to this effort your stories save lives
- The role of parents in choosing conversion therapy - or choosing to affirm
- Your stories are uniquely powerful and they are messengers we need
- Parents and family can tell this story without retraumatizing survivors





What Can You Do?

- Building coalitions of various partners in states and communities like yours across the country
 - Examples: Pennsylvania, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Kentucky
- Public education and storytelling matters
 - Op-eds, testimony, meeting with local lawmakers, churches
- Helping make connections based on your local relationships
- NAMI as leaders: we are stronger together and NAMI has a large reach as a mental health advocacy organization

- Educate yourselves and others about LGBTQ
 Youth Mental Health Allies educate allies
- Volunteer with The Trevor Project or another youth and family serving organization like PFLAG
- Public education and storytelling matters: Opeds, testimony, movie nights, speaking with churches
- Be a safe place for LGBTQ youth to come
